Importance of Statistical tools for Research and Data Analysis

A Faculty Development Programme on "Importance of Statistical tools for Research and Data Analysis" was conducted on 2nd August 2016 at the conference hall. The objective of the programme was to impart the various statistical tools required for research and Data Analysis. The resource person Ms. Sumitha Achar, Asst. She also said that one of the most important uses of statistics in data analysis is that it helps in keeping human bias away from research conclusion with the help of proper statistical treatment. With the help of scales & measurements in data analysis a researcher can filter both qualitative and quantitative data for any research work. Thus, it can

be said that need of scales measurement in data analysis is of utmost importance for both the research and the researcher. All the faculties benefitted from the session on statistical tools. The programme was coordinated by Mrs. Divya Uchil.

Research and Publications
