Executive summary

"A STUDY ON SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROBLEMS OF UNORGANISED SECTOR WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO BEEDI WORKERS IN DAKSHINA KANNADA DISTRICT"

The term unorganised sector when used in the Indian context is defined by National Commission for Enterprises in the Unorganized Sector, in their Report on Conditions of Work and Promotion of Livelihoods in the Unorganised Sector as consisting of all unincorporated private enterprises owned by individuals or households engaged in the sale or production of goods and services operated on a proprietary or partnership basis and with less than ten total workers. Amongst the characteristic features of this sector are ease of entry, smaller scale of operation, local ownership, uncertain legal status, labour-intensive and operating using lower technology based methods, flexible pricing, less sophisticated packing, absence of a brand name, unavailability of good storage facilities and an effective distribution network, inadequate access to government schemes, finance and government aid, lower entry barriers for employees, a higher proportion of migrants with a lower rate of compensation. Employees of enterprises belonging to the unorganised sector have lower job security and poorer chances of growth, and no leaves and paid holidays, they have lower protection against employers indulging in unfair or illegal practices. In this study primary data is collected by issuing questionnaire in Dakshina Kannada District.

The personal interview will also be done with the Beedi worker for better understanding of the problems.

Certain books and journals were consulted for the understanding of relevant concepts and aspects of unorganized sectors and beedi worker. The study revealed that Beedi workers were from the marginalized sections of the society and therefore they were socially and economically backward. Poverty was the main reason that induced the respondents to take up Beedi work as an occupation.

Majority of the beedi workers are women and the entire family depends on only these earnings and most of the time beedi workers are not aware of their rights. For the study 120 respondents were selected in different taluk places of the district.

My study is keen to learn about the conditions of Beedi workers. Dakshina kannada and Udupi districts are one of the most important region where in Beedi is the main source of income for the many people. People who are engaged in Beedi work are facing serious problems including poverty, health hazard, family problems, poor housing facilities, insufficient nutritious food, unhygienic the environment, illiteracy, physical stress and debts etc. The findings of the study will be useful to NGOs working for the development of the unorganized sector.

Majority of the respondents are Female in the study And they belong to age group of 36 to 50. Most of the beedi workers are unorganized and they are falls bellow Rs. 3000 of monthly household income. The govt. must give special consideration to uplift the worker socially & economically.

It also highlights the various problems faced by a beedi worker either by lack of quality of raw material or by the middlemen or health problems faced by beedi workers. Overall the govt should advise beedi works company to protect the interest of beedi workers.

Got a very good opportunity to analyze and understand the many problems faced by beedi workers in Dakshinna Kannada district and also got an opportunity to speak to many women worker in this unorganised sector and to know what actual facility they avail in their organization and what are their expectations.
